"Wonder Women in Science – Inspiring and Empowering the Next Generation"
Organised by the Council of the Hong Kong Laureate Forum (the HKLF)
Attracted Near 200 Online and in-person Participants

Held in a hybrid format by combining physical exhibition, seminars and round-table dialogue sessions with online platform, the "Wonder Women in Science – Inspiring and Empowering the Next Generation" event, organised by the HKLF, concluded today and it had attracted near 200 fellow scientists, young scientists and students who are interested in science. The event gathered both renowned local and international female scientists and researchers to share their experience in the pursuit of science.

Video interview with Professor Inez Fung of the University of California, Berkeley kicked off the event. Professor Fung vividly shared with the audience her academic and research journey, her experience as a young woman studying mathematics and researching in meteorology way back when and her message to our current and up-and-coming young scientists. Then, Dr the Hon Mrs Rita Fan, GBM, GBS, JP, member of the Council of the Hong Kong Laureate Forum delivered the welcome speech for us. Dr Fan, "Hopefully through today's programme, apart from learning how scientists work, we might also learn to appreciate the contributions of female scientists as well as offering them the respect and honour they deserve. For our young audience, after you have seen what is possible, I hope you will say to yourself, "I can do it!""

Professor Siew Ng of The Chinese University of Hong Kong started the seminar session by giving a talk and sharing on "A Journey from Science to Magic". Professor Christine Foyer of University of Birmingham joined us via Zoom and share with us on "What Makes a Good Career". It was followed by a panel discussion session hosted by Professor Shuk-han Cheng of City University of Hong Kong in which the three scientists discussed and answered questions raised by both in-person and online audience. Last but not least, presentation on "You are ABLE – Aspiration comBines with Luck and Efforts" and round up by Professor Cheng brought the seminar session to a successful conclusion.

Another highlight of the event is the round-table dialogue sessions moderated by participating female scientists. Professor Cheung and Professor Ng, together with Professor Hei-man Chow of The Chinese University of Hong Kong, Dr Jane Dai of the University of Hong Kong, Professor Rhea Patricia Liem of The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, Dr Jade Shi of Hong Kong Baptist University and Dr Xin Zhao of The Hong Kong Polytechnic University had direct idea exchanges with participants in a casual and small group settings.
