[Grand Opening of Cross-generational, Cross-cultural and Cross-disciplinary Global Prestigious Science Event]

The Inaugural Hong Kong Laureate Forum Announces Official Kick-off, convening Shaw Laureates and Top Young Scientists for Exchanges in Hong Kong to Unlock Infinite Possibilities in Science

The inaugural Hong Kong Laureate Forum (the Forum) organised by the Council of the Hong Kong Laureate Forum (the HKLF) and fully sponsored by the Lee Shau Kee Foundation – a world-class science event that brings together top scientific minds from around the world for cross-generational, cross-cultural and cross-disciplinary exchanges – officially commenced today at the Hong Kong Science Park. The Forum lasts six days, from 13 to 18 November 2023. With its theme "Meeting of Inspirational Minds", the Forum gathered over 20 Shaw Laureates from around the world in the disciplines of Astronomy, Life Science and Medicine, and Mathematical Sciences, distinguished scientists as well as around 200 young scientists from almost 30 different countries and regions for exchanging views, insights and aspirations in science.

The week-long Forum features a wide range of engaging programmes, including keynote speeches by Shaw Laureates, thought-provoking plenary sessions, breakout sessions with Shaw Laureates and world-renowned scientists, global trending topic sessions, and poster presentations by young scientists, etc. The areas of discussion and sharing will mainly cover the three Shaw Prize disciplines, with diverse topics from black holes, cellular mechanism, to discrete geometry. Shaw Laureates and distinguished scientists will share their profound insights in their respective research areas with young scientists through their speeches and panel discussions. The young scientists can also showcase their latest research ideas in poster presentation to spark intellectual exchanges.

The opening ceremony held today was officiated by **the Hon John Lee, GBM, SBS, PDSM, PMSM**, Chief Executive of the HKSAR and **Prof Timothy W Tong, BBS, JP**, Chairman of the HKLF, together with our Principal Sponsor **Dr Martin Lee Ka-Shing, GBS, JP**, Chairman of Henderson Land Group and Director of the Lee Shau Kee Foundation; and Major Partner **Dr Raymond Chan**, Chair of the Shaw Prize Foundation and Board Member of the HKLF.

In delivering his welcome remarks, **Prof Timothy W Tong, BBS, JP**, the Chairman of the HKLF said, "Apart from an exciting lineup of speakers, who will share their research and insights on a wide range of topics, the Forum will also provide an excellent opportunity for all to exchange knowledge, network, and to collaborate with each other." Apart from the discussions and sharing sessions, during this momentous week, the Forum participants will be exposed to ongoing science and innovation projects in Hong Kong, by visiting local universities, InnoHK centres, HKSTP Experience Centre, Hong Kong Research and Development Centres, and Cyberport. They will visit the Hong Kong Science Museum and Hong Kong Space Museum as well and attend science seminars to be organised by the HKLF in collaborations with both museums. These two seminars will also be open to the public and local secondary students.

In addition to various visits, an unprecedented dialogue between Shaw Laureates with participating secondary school students is another highlight of the official programmes. A tour to the West Kowloon Cultural District and a special reception featuring local delicacies will be held to allow the Forum participants to experience Hong Kong's unique culture. Throughout the Forum, live streaming and programme archives will be made available for specific sessions to reach out to a wider audience in Hong Kong and beyond.

The Forum is an international academic exchange platform to connect the current and future generations in scientific pursuit. It provides opportunities for young scientists and foster exchanges with experts in various disciplines, enabling them to gain inspiration and benefit from the transmission of knowledge and experiences. The HKLF believes that this prestigious platform will not only help to establish Hong Kong as a vital hub for local and international academic exchanges among scientists of different generations, cultures and disciplines, but also showcase to the world that Hong Kong is paving the way for becoming a leading innovation and technology hub.
